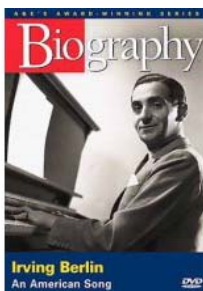
Windsor Pub & TGIF Happy Hour! 3:30pm Pub
